# INTERNATIONAL MIRROR CLASS ASSOCIATION (IMCA) 2015 WORLD CHAMPIOSHIP

28th December 2014 - 9th January 2015

### **Notice of Race**

The International Mirror Class Association South Africa in conjunction with Theewater Sports Club as the Organising Authority will conduct the Mirror World Championship 2015 (including the Mirror African Championships) on the waters of Theewaterskloof Dam, from 28<sup>th</sup> December 2014 to 9<sup>th</sup> January 2015.

#### 1. Rules

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2013 2016.*
- 1.2. No national prescriptions will apply.
- 1.3. RRS Appendix P "Special Procedures for Rule 42" will apply. Appendix P is changed by deleting P2.3. P2.2 shall apply for Second and Subsequent penalties.
- 1.4. Boats participating in this regatta shall conform to the *Equipment Rules of Sailing (ERS) 2013 2016*, the *Class Rules of the International Mirror Class*, this *Notice of Race*, and the *Sailing Instructions*.
- 1.5. Under rule 87, rule 9.2 of the International Mirror class rules is changed for this regatta to allow cameras and electronic tracking devices provided by the organising authority.

#### 2. Advertising

2.1. Advertising will be permitted in accordance with Class Rules and ISAF Regulation 20 - Advertising Code Table 1.

#### 3. Eligibility and Entry

- 3.1. The regatta is open to all boats that comply with the Rules of the International Mirror Class.
- 3.2. All skippers and crew shall be financial members of an Association that is affiliated with their national International Mirror Class Association or where none exists, direct members of the IMCA.
- 3.3. All skippers and crews shall provide proof of membership to their countrycs ISAF Member National Authority.
- 3.4. Eligible boats may enter by completing the entry and event disclaimer form found on the website <a href="https://www.2015worlds.mirrorsailing.org">www.2015worlds.mirrorsailing.org</a> and sending it, together with the required fee, to be received by the organising authority no later than 15th November 2014.
- 3.5. Late entries may, at the discretion of the Organising Authority, be accepted for:
- 3.5.1. Mirror African Championships until 17h00 on 28th December 2014.
- 3.5.2. World Championships until 17h00 on 4th January 2015.

#### 3.6. Cancellation & Refund

- 3.6.1. If a competitor cancels the entry before the entry closing date, 15<sup>th</sup> November 2014, the entry fee paid, less a R750 fee for bank and administration charges, will be refunded.
- 3.6.2. No entry fee is refundable for cancellations after the 15<sup>th</sup> November 2014.

#### 6.1. Each boat shall produce a valid measurement certificate.

#### 7. Sailing Instructions

- 7.1. The Sailing Instructions will be available from the event website <a href="www.2015worlds.mirrorsailing.org">www.2015worlds.mirrorsailing.org</a> and in hard copy at registration.
- 7.1.1. Mirror African Championships 0900 Sunday 28th December 2014
- 7.1.2. Worlds 0900 Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> January 2015

#### 8. Racing Format and Courses

- 8.1. All boats entered in the regatta will compete in the Open World Championship.
- 8.2. Details of the courses to be sailed together with how this will be signalled will be published in the Sailing Instructions. Courses may be any one of Windward Leeward Triangle course, Windward Leeward Course, or Trapezoid Courses. Racing will take place on Theewaterskloof Dam adjacent to Theewater Sports Club.

#### 9. Scoring

- 9.1. A total of 4 races are required to be completed to constitute a championship.
  - 9.1.1. When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boatos series score will be the total of her race scores.
  - 9.1.2. When from 5 to 9 races have been completed, a boatos series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst excludable score.
  - 9.1.3. When 10 or more races have been completed, a boatos series score will be the total of her races excluding her two worst excludable scores.

#### 10. International Jury

- 10.1. An international jury will be appointed for the Mirror World Championship in accordance with RRS Appendix N and perform the duties listed in RRS Appendix N2.
- 10.2. The decisions of the International Jury will be final as provided in Rule 70.5

#### 11. Coach / Individual Support Boats

11.1. Coach or individual support boats must be registered with the Race Office, carry the official identification provided and comply with the official communications protocol. Team leaders, coaches and other support personnel shall stay at least 150m outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the preparatory signal until all boats have finished or retired or the race committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment.

#### 12. Charter boats

- 12.1. A limited number of charter boats will be available. Details, terms and conditions will posted on www.2015worlds.mirrorsailing.org
- 12.2. Appendix G3 will apply.

## ARRIVAL AT TSC

Enter the office at the Entrance Gate. You will be issued with an access control card. If you have prebooked your accommodation at the club, you will be checked off against the list and then directed to the camping area. If you have not yet booked, the attendant will assist accordingly.

#### Washing all boats at the Wash Bay

All boats, trailers and towing vehicles, entering and leaving TSC will be required to have an underbody wash. There is no charge for this and the good reason therefore is as per the directive issued by the relative government departments.

Please proceed straight down the gravel road and the wash bay officials will assist you. It should not take more than 3 minutes to wash your boat. After your boat has been washed proceed to your right, (follow the arrows) and you will again be on the tarred entrance road. You may than proceed to the clubhouse area for a welcome from Mark at the restaurant or a deserved refreshment in the bar. Otherwise you may proceed directly to your allocated camping area.

Please offload your boats in the area next to the slipway and immediately take them to the launching area where the boat tie-downs are. Please then park the trailer in the trailer park. No boats or trailers are to be parked at the campsites.



## **CAMPING AT TSC**




**Regatta Camping & Car Parking Areas** 

The camping area is near the clubhouse area and is reserved for competitors and their supporters in the above demarcated areas. The one area is for tents only and has no electrical facilities. The other area is for caravans, campervans and tents and has electrical facilities. Limited amounts of additional shade will be provided in these areas.

TSC staff and officials will direct and assist you to the camping, trailer / dolly and car parking areas. Please do not store trailers or boats in amongst the camping areas. Cars are limited to 1 per site. Other cars may be parked in the regatta trailer parking area. Your cooperation in adhering to the instructions will be appreciated.

Please ensure you allow sufficient space for your neighbours to camp.

Please do not drink the water from the taps. There is a large water tank situated behind the clubhouse ablution facility and next to the Plaat ablution block filled with natural spring water. Water may also be purchased from the Cafeteria and in town.

#### Restaurant, Food Court, Bar & Braai (BBQ) Fires

The Cafeteria and the Bar are in the Clubhouse area. The Food Court and refreshment stall is outside, opposite the clubhouse, in the Afdak area. Please note that the refreshments served in the Food Court area are more quickly prepared and are cheaper than our cafeteria or bar. Free coffee and tea will be available in the mornings at the Food Court. If you prefer filter coffee, you may purchase from the Cafeteria.

#### **GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS**

- Admission is strictly reserved.
- Strictly No braai fires at regatta camping sites, please use the facilities at the clubhouse area.
- Club officials have the right to stop any dangerous practices on or off the water and will, if necessary, have the offending person removed from the water or premises.
- The destruction of vegetation, animal or bird life is prohibited. No firearms, weapons (including pellet and 'BB' guns) or game traps may be brought onto the Club premises.
- Swimming anywhere is at own risk. Use of the demarcated swimming areas is advisable.
- All litter must be disposed of in the refuse bins provided.
- Motor vehicles are restricted to specific roads and parking areas. The speed limit is 12km/hr.

## REGISTRATION AND MEASUREMENT

Please come to registration at the Afdak (opposite the clubhouse) to complete the registration, book your meals, purchase regatta clothing, check your information is correct, finalise your accommodation arrangements, collect your  $\div$ goodie bagø and book your time slot for the measurement of your boat. A credit card machine will be available if required.

Measurement will also be at the Afdak and the Event Marquee alongside. Please book a time slot and ensure you are present 15 minutes before the booked time. DO NOT leave your boat unattended in the Measurement area ó it will be impounded ©.

#### BEFORE MEASUREMENT


Please prepare your boat so it is ready for measurement with the sails, spars and foils you are going to use for the Worlds.

All competitors must take their measurement certificates, 3 sails, hull, mast, spinnaker pole (can be left attached to the boom) and foils to the measurement area.

This year we are going to weigh boats with control lines and some removable items in place and only fully strip boats that are close to the minimum weight. So please remove bungs and hatch covers, compasses, anchors, tow lines, all sheets. Leave shacked on blocks, shroud plates, kicking strap, control lines & stoppers, etc in place.

If your boat is close to minimum weight in the condition described above, you will be asked to represent it ready to be weighed in accordance with rule 1.8.2.

When passed, the sails, foils and spars will be have an event sticker or marker applied.



## RACING AND BOAT PARKING

We are trusting that everyone will have the most memorable time at these African and Worlds Championships. We thank the Principle Race Officer, Bruce Keytel, who will be handling both regattags. For the Worlds, we also welcome Charlotte Greppe and her team of Jurors who will officiate over the event.

In order to run a successful regatta, certain rules need to be adhered to. Please bear in mind that this is the busiest time of the year at TSC and we need to respect the other club members who are not competing in the events.

#### **Boat Parking**

Please note the diagram below ó please adhere to these boat parking rules.

**PLEASE** do not leave your cars, trailers, boats or dollies in the õredö zone ó this causes unnecessary congestion. Please park all trailers in the demarcated area to keep them out of the way.

And **PLEASE** ensure your boat is tied down overnight as the wind does sometimes come up quite strongly.
